SGS 2024 FAQs

Strand A

- Q1. What do we mean by 'community integration' and 'displaced people'?
 - Help to integrate people who have been displaced by conflict into new 'host'
 communities within the countries specified. This could be people who have been
 obliged by war or armed conflict to move from one to another of the countries
 specified, or people who have moved from their homes to another part of the same
 country.
 - This could include a specific focus on particular groups of displaced people, including those that are vulnerable or face additional barriers to integration.

Q2. Who can apply?

- CSOs in Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan
- Q3. How much can we apply for?
 - no more than £4,000 in total from BEARR
 - you must offer co-funding: BEARR's contribution should be no more than 50% of total project costs.
- Q4. Can we offer costs in kind (office rental, equipment etc) as part of our contribution to the project?
 - Yes.
- Q5. Do we have to have a partner organisation in our project?
 - Yes, we are looking for projects that involve co-operation between two or more civil society organisations. The application should explain how the work on the project will be split between the partners. In our monitoring form, to be filled out on completion of the project, we will be asking CSOs to explain how the project helped develop a long-lasting partnership between CSOs.
- Q6. Can we ask for funds to cover office equipment?
 - You can include some tech costs needed for the project (e.g., software, laptop, etc.). But these should account for no more than 20% of the requested BEARR grant.
- Q7. What kind of projects have the best chance of being funded?
 - Projects that genuinely and clearly support community integration of displaced people.

- Projects that are trying to do something **new or imaginative.**
- Projects by small CSOs that do not have access to funding from larger donors.

Q8. How long do we have to complete our project?

• we usually expect projects to be completed within six months from the time funds are received from us, but in certain circumstances we will accept a delay. (Funds may not be delivered until late spring/early summer.)

Strand B

Q9. Who can apply?

• Only previous BEARR grant recipients in Ukraine and Moldova

Q10. How much can we apply for?

• £1,000 is the maximum grant

Q11. Who are the project's beneficiaries?

• The staff and volunteers of the organisation applying for the grant.
